1. Why US Club versus WYS?

- Majority of NSYSA competitive teams plays under WYS.
- Freedom of promotion within the league structure of US Club, within the PSPL format there is no ceiling. WYS sanctioned leagues limits teams ability play at all competitive levels.

2. What prevents one centralized tryout?

- Club tryouts are set for February and should go forward as club's have planned.
- The general consensus of the group was it would make sense for Bremerton, KAFC, Tracyton to host tryouts together.

- 2. I want to send out a special thank you to all the referees that gave their time to officiate our games.
 - a. As a note; 80% or better of all games had a referee.
 - b. Small sided may have had a few that were parents. But as a general rule, these referees do not report the score. And based on scoring, we had 80% reporting.
 - c. Full sided referees may not always have those full 3-man teams. But 87% of all games had at a minimum a center referee.
- 3. Game reporting:
 - a. I would like to thank the efforts of the Clubs to get Coach Reporting to be successful and responsible.
 - b. Full sided coaches reported at a pace of 90% for the year.
 - c. Small Sided coaches reported at a rate of 77% for the year.
 - d. Reporting has many valuable benefits.
 - i. Allows next year's competitive placement.
 - ii. Identifies problems being experienced by teams.
 - iii. Fairly reports team Sportsmanship ratings.

- 5. I want to thank those that took the time to attend the new Referee Clinics.
 - a. Our diminishing numbers of referee are supported by these efforts.
 - b. A larger pool of referees also negates the all too often concern, "This Referee Again."
 - c. I ask all the Clubs to set a goal of getting more referees from within for next year.
- 6. Games forfeited:
 - a. The full sided game had 3 games reported with no opponent.
 - i. Yet no games were reported forfeited.
 - b. The small sided game had 3 Games reported forfeited.
- 7. The forfeited game is not entirely unreasonable. But the reasons we saw this year are not of those reasonable causes.
 - a. I'll never play that team again defines an emotional reasoning.
 - b. I don't enjoy playing Club "X". Not a justifiable reason.
 - c. They are too aggressive. Statistics most often does not prove this.
- 8. I will be asking the NSYSA Executive Board to stiffen the rules related to teams that forfeit.
- 9. Team Sportsmanship rating:
 - a. Full sided coaches gave ratings at the following ratios:
 - i. 20 Coaches rated their opponent at a level of '1'.
 - ii. 77 Coaches rated their opponent at a level of '2'.
 - iii. 276 Coaches rated their opponent at a level of '3'.
 - iv. 461 Coaches rated their opponent at a level of '4'.
 - b. To my amazement, coaches give poor ratings without comment. If the game was this bad, the experience needs to be shared.
 - c. Too many of the poor ratings where about an individual. Not the team!
 - i. We have two reporting windows:
 - 1. The "Notes" area better serves for expression of concern towards a single individual or parents.
 - 2. The Sportsmanship "Comments" window is about the team as a whole. Not individuals.
 - Rate the team based on team considerations and "<u>Note</u>" the <u>concxernsz</u> of individuals.
 - d. I will be bringing a request to modify the Sportsmanship options to a 5 Level rating system. I will ask that the window be formatted that the rating of '3' be fixed in the module and coaches must change this rate for specified reason.
 - e. We cannot fix our issues if this module is not effective.

 $\sqrt{\rm I}$ have reviewed reports of those new referees being mistreated by coaches and parents alike.

m I}$ also would like to dispel a belief that seems to be abundant in many of the Clubs.

- Misconduct can be awarded without a card being shown.
- Unacceptable conduct to the referee, players, or others is still misconduct.
- Y Far too may reports have been submitted detailing foul language and unacceptable conduct by <u>Parents and Coaches</u>. Do not believe that this is acceptable conduct merely because misconduct is not awarded. (i.e.... <u>CARDS</u>.)
- $\sqrt{\text{SSReferees}}$ should never be subject to the kinds of treatment they have been subject to these past games.
- ✓ It is documented that the average new Grade 8 Referee will not award a misconduct for the first 3 - 4 years. Gaining confidence and understanding of the application of the Rule of Law, and Learning and trusting in the decisions; are all critical to the referee maturation process. And learning the correct application of the issue of misconduct will precede the first issue of any card.
- $\sqrt{}$ Therefore Unacceptable conduct is not necessarily followed with misconduct awarded. The simple act of misconduct warrants Administrative review.
