Subj: June 2019 VP of Comp Report

- 1. Yet another shout out in support of the NSYSA Registrars bucket. Safe Sports will bring significant changes to our processes and expectations. Please be patient. But do be vigilant and keep an eye out in supporting the progress of this new program. The process will be dropped on us at the final moment of forming teams and associating coaches.
 - a. The reason I bring this concern to you is this:
 - i. All registration and training will begin as Clubs are forming teams.
 - ii. Coaches and staff may not be associated with teams until this certification process is complete.
 - iii. Coaches and staff must be affiliated with the team before team practices can be held.
 - iv. There will be burps and hiccups in the process.
- 2. We have raised the ranks of our referee community in our area. Will new class be forthcoming? Clubs please assess your area referee pool and look for adequate numbers. Please follow the following link:

New (Grade 8) Referee - Saturday training Feb 9 2019 8am-4-pm

- 3. Small Sided Referee and the RMA requirement.
 - a. There will be much confusion and difficulty getting our Small Sided Referees ready for this season. We need to start the process a little earlier.
 - b. I am creating a slide show presentation, which I will forward to all Clubs. It may support the training of your young referees.
- 4. We have several expected changes that have been approved by the Ruling Body of FIFA. The outcome of these decisions has not filtered down from FIFA to USSF and ultimately WYS.

We are waiting this information Washington Soccer Referee Committee and hoping for a briefing from KPSRA.

A brief synopsis of the rules follows:



Free kicks: No attacking players in wall

The IFAB has approved a rule change which prohibits attacking players- i.e. those from the team on attacking from the free kick - from being in the wall. Specifically, when there is a wall of three or more players attackers are not allowed within one meter of it.

Any attacking player found to be less than one meter from the wall when a free kick is taken will be penalized and the other team will be rewarded with an indirect free kick.

The idea behind the change is to avoid time-wasting and disturbances between players that may result in physical altercations.

The IFAB said: "There is no legitimate tactical justification for attackers to be in the 'wall' and their presence is against the 'spirit of the game' and often damages the image of the game."

Substitutions: Players must leave pitch at nearest point

The rule-makers have struck a further blow against cynicism in the game by introducing a change to substitution protocol.

Players who are being taken off and replaced must now leave the pitch by the nearest point on the touchline, which means we will no longer be forced to endure preposterously slow walks to the half-way line.

So players will have to think twice about how they exit the pitch and, not only that, they must make their way straight to the technical area or dressing room otherwise they risk being sanctioned for unsporting behavior.

Yellow & red cards for coaches

In order to clamp down on difficult behavior from coaches who don't see eye to eye with the referee or their opposite number, officials will be able to show them yellow or red cards, in the same way they do with players.



If, in the event of a touchline melee for example, the offending individual cannot be identified for punishment, the senior coach who is in the technical area will be the default recipient.

Penalty kicks: Goalkeepers must have at least one foot on line

That hasn't changed with the latest update to the rules, which dictate that the shot-stopper must not be moving or touching the goalposts.

The new rule changes also say that the goalkeeper must have at least part of one foot on or in line with the goal-line.

"Allowing the goalkeeper to have only one foot touching the goal line (or, if jumping, in line with the goal line) when the penalty kick is taken is a more practical approach as it is easier to identify if both feet are not on the line," goes the IFAB's explanation.

"As the kicker can 'stutter' in the run, it is reasonable that the goalkeeper can take one step in anticipation of the kick."

As well as those points, the penalty taker will now be permitted to receive a quick treatment if necessary before taking the kick.

Handball: Accidental offences deemed free kicks

Essentially, the changes will mean that there will be no goal in cases where the ball accidentally strikes a player's hand before crossing over the line.

Similarly, if a player has accidentally handled the ball and created an advantage or subsequently scores, they will be penalized with a free kick.

Despite the IFAB's attempts, we reckon that this one will still cause plenty of debate and consternation.

The dropped ball is no more. Well, at least not as we know it.

If play is stopped inside the penalty area the ball will simply be dropped for the goalkeeper.



If it is stopped outside the penalty area the ball will be dropped for a player from the team that last touched the ball. In all cases, players will have to be at least four meters (four and a half yards) away.

Here's the IFAB's explanation: "The current dropped ball procedure often leads to a 'manufactured' restart which is 'exploited' unfairly (e.g. kicking the ball out for a throw-in deep in the opponents' half) or an aggressive confrontation.

"Returning the ball to the team that last played it restores what was 'lost' when play was stopped, except in the penalty area where it is simpler to return the ball to the goalkeeper.

"To prevent that team gaining an unfair advantage, all players of both teams, except the player receiving the ball, must be at least 4m (4.5 yds) away."

 - a. As we are typically ending by 1:00ish, no lunch will be served.
 - b. There is an expresso station @ Hazelwood YMCA and therefore coffee will not be provided. Water will be available.
 - c. Light snacks will be provided.
- 6. Yesterday we had lightning strikes in the Puget Sound area. As a result some trees were fallen and landed on homes. We have predicted thunderstorms for the next few days and I caution you to review NSYSA's policy on 'Severe Weather.'
